5. Small Groups

7. Conference Atmosphere

Women would feel seen and loved from start to finish

8. Renovated Bible Study

Susie, Eli, and Tarah would have divine wisdom and guidance to write and edit; no one taking offense Published and ready for distribution before September 13, 2025

9. Women Attending

Diversity of women in attendance: single, single moms, divorced, married, married with kids, widows Women would be open and ready for the content

Safe travel for women attending (locally and non-local)

10. Spiritual Warfare - Part 1

Strongholds broken: addictions, depression, co-dependency, control, shame, trauma, etc. Generational family curses broken

Mental Health and physical health (warfare against the mind and body)

Healing and deliverance through truth and revelation

11. Spiritual Warfare - Part 2

Exposure of unforgiveness and bitterness

Conviction over grumbling, complaining, spirit of comparison/competition, apathy, blame-shifting, etc.

Defensiveness against the message or at-the-table talk

Protection for the entire Renovated team, Small Group Leaders, and their families

12. Attitudes

Women will own their *own* stuff
Self-righteousness
Preconceived ideas/expectations of the content or conference
Her husband's or children's attitude when she returns home after the conference

13. Families of attendees

Husbands: salvation, submission, repentance, desire to be a blessing to his wife
Protection for the caregiver of children while a woman is at the conference
Health and wellness of her family while she's away
